

## Q&A: MOTOR VEHICLE ACT SECTION 34 EXEMPTIONS FOR VISITING SEASONAL AGRICULTURAL WORKERS

On July 30, 2010, the *Motor Vehicle Act (MVA)* and the *MVA Regulations* were amended to allow visitors participating in the Seasonal Agricultural Workers Program (SAWP) who hold a valid licence in their home jurisdiction to remain exempt from the requirement to obtain a British Columbia Driver's Licence (BCDL) for the duration of his or her contract.

- **Q**: Who is eligible for the exemption? How can a driver obtain the exemption?
- **A**: In order to be eligible, a driver must:
  - Hold a Mexico- or Commonwealth Caribbean-issued driver's licence that is valid for the class of vehicle being driven;
  - Not be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada;
  - Be participating in the Seasonal Agricultural Workers Program; and,
  - Be employed in the agricultural sector.

A driver who meets the above criteria is exempt from the requirement to hold a BCDL, and does not need to take any additional actions, except to carry documentation while driving. The exemption is valid until the date shown on his or her work permit.

- **Q:** What documentation should a driver carry? What will happen if a driver does not have the documentation?
- **A:** A driver claiming a SAWP exemption should carry the following documentation while driving, and should present it to a police officer upon request:
  - A driver's licence from the driver's home jurisdiction that is valid for the class of vehicle being driven;
  - An International Driving Permit in one of Canada's official languages;
  - A valid work permit issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada under SAWP.

The driver must be able to satisfy the police officer that he or she meets the requirements in Division 30 of the MVA Regulations, and the above documents should suffice. If a driver claiming a SAWP exemption does not have the above documentation, the peace officer may issue to driver of the vehicle a violation ticket for "No Driver's Licence." If the driver has previously been issued such a ticket, the driver may be a candidate for impoundment, and the vehicle may be impounded under the Vehicle Impoundment Program.

- **Q:** Does the driver need to carry documentation for the first 6 months?
- A: At minimum, the driver must still carry his or her valid home driver's licence, and will be exempt under subsection 34 (1.1) (a). However, it is *strongly advised* that the driver also carry an International Driving Permit.

- **Q:** Does the exemption apply to drivers in other programs (e.g. the Low Skilled Worker Program)?
- **A:** No. At this time, the exemption only applies to drivers in SAWP.
- **Q:** Why should a driver carry his or her work permit?
- A: A driver's work permit indicates to police that a visitor is participating in SAWP. Police officers will check the "EMPLOYER" line for the phrase "CC/MEXSAWP" (see left side of Figure 1). Police will also be checking the "VALID UNTIL" box to ensure that the permit is current (see right side of Figure 1).
